We are vigilant to executive led limitations on the rights of individuals, communities and the Profession. Respect for the balance of power between the law makers and the citizens is important and sensitive. Respect for the law is regarded as a fundamental for “open and free” societies.

The United Nations has described its agenda for 2030, with the objective that there be a clear understanding that human rights, peace and security reinforce societal and economic development. The UN describes the central role of the rule of law to achieving and sustaining peace, realising the vision in SDG 16- “Peace, Justice and Strong Institutions”.

Our clients work in an environment where supply chains are audited, data gathered to monitor environmental impact, modern day slavery, bribery, corruption, money laundering and referral arrangements. So many reasons for authorities to “review” the detail of a lawyer client relationship despite client confidentiality. We will consider the context in which we work, where, in so many jurisdictions the executive works with the law makers to limit access to justice.

We have speakers from Bars and collective members from all continents, responding to different challenges in the common cause of defending the rule of law and seeking to make access to justice a credible mechanism for the resolution of complaints and disputes.

Questions that arise:

1. How do we describe Rule of Law so that it is understood and valued by citizens, practitioners and politicians alike?

Parties in international transactions, and their lawyers, need to ensure transnational legal certainty, and avoid repeated litigation and conflicting decisions. However, States have valid reasons to deny foreign judgments or awards the same force that they grant their own domestic decisions, since the foreign procedure may be viewed as deficient or the outcome of the foreign litigation objectionable, or immunity issues may arise when sovereign assets are at stake. The recent 2019 Hague Convention was designed to promote effective access to justice for all and to facilitate rule-based multilateral trade and investment, and mobility, through judicial co-operation. Schematically speaking, this access can primarily be achieved through a voluntary transfer. From this perspective, in Europe the GDPR has implemented a protective framework that produces effects beyond European borders, through adequacy decisions by the European Commission, and the ad hoc measures and verification protocols that it implements to ensure the compliance of data transfers in third countries. In their interactions with the USA, undertakings that are subject to the GDPR are in a position of relative legal uncertainty following the CJEU Schrems II judgment of 16 July 2020. Access to data may also be imposed or demanded by a third country authority. The most obvious example is that of the Clarifying Lawful Overseas Use of Data (CLOUD) Act, which has contributed to the blurring of the lines between compliant practices and practices that can lead to penalties for all stakeholders who are doubly accountable, i.e., who are subject to both local law and US law. The CLOUD Act, in the same way as its equivalent in numerous other countries, raises the issue of the injunctions to transfer personal data that are issued to foreign organizations and the means they have to oppose this.
